I have recently shifted to supporting health system transformation as an independent contractor. I am excited to engage in projects where I can contribute my knowledge about primary care and behavioral health valuebased care transformation, and my strengths in human-centered design, stakeholder engagement and facilitation, collaborative strategy and implementation planning, patient-centered communication, and visual thinking. Ongoing projects include:

- Serving as Lead Practice Facilitator for the Integrated Social Health Implementation and Evaluation (universal social needs screening and referral) initiative with Kaiser Permanente Washington.
- Contributing subject matter expertise on training multi-disciplinary health care teams in patient-centered communication to the Kaiser Permanente national program office for Social Health.
- Leading strategy development and multi-stakeholder planning to design a pilot-to-spread initiative to improve behavioral health access with the Oregon Association of Community Mental Health Programs, funded by the Delta Center for a Thriving Safety Net (Robert Wood Johnson Foundation) and the Oregon Health Authority.
